

Household Clean-Up Day is June 19:

- The eagerly anticipated Household Clean-Up Day is Saturday, June 19. Learn more about which acceptable items can be placed curbside for collection by LRS on the [Village website](#). Residents can dispose of household items including clothing, draperies, books, furniture, scrap metal, and appliances (household garbage, electronics, landscape waste, liquids, tires, batteries, medical waste, and construction and demolition debris are not eligible). No registration is required. All items for disposal must be on the curb by 7 am the morning of collection day. Some items ineligible for Household Clean-Up Day may qualify as bulk items that require additional stickers. Learn more [here](#). Responsible Pet Ownership:

- A few residents have reached out to express concerns about dogs roaming freely around the Village. Please be reminded that dogs and cats are not allowed to run free, bark or howl on residential or public property, and must be kept on a leash no longer than seven feet at all times. Dog owners must carry appropriate supplies to immediately clean up their animal's waste. This information is also available on the [Village website](#). The Police Department frequently receives calls about [lost or found pets](#). If the pet has a [pet license](#), as required by the Village, Police can easily reunite the animal with its owner.

- The Village of Western Springs' French Market operates on Sundays from 9 am - 1 pm, from May through the end of October. The French Market's location is on Hillgrove Avenue in front of the historic water tower, between Lawn Avenue and Grand Avenue.
