


Western Springs FROM THE PRESIDENT

May 9 Board Meeting (the full agenda and meeting video is posted [online](#)):

The Board voted to remand an amended application to amend the Timber Trails PUD ordinance to the Plan Commission for further study and a second public hearing, the date of which is still to be determined.

The following committees reported on items for consideration and/or action at the Village Board's next meeting on May 23: Properties & Recreation (including the Urban Forestry Management Plan), Public Works & Water (including a temporary waiver on construction noise limitations for Wolf Road), Public Health & Safety (including a proclamation for National Police Week), and General Government (including the staffing and pay plan for 2022).

The Board then moved to closed session to discuss the proposed sale of Village-owned right-of-way property, and staffing/human resources items. Following the closed session, the Board reconvened and voted on the sale of one of the properties that were considered.

The summer schedule of Board of Trustee meetings will be: June 13, July 11, and August 15.

- The WSPD will hold a fun-filled family [Meet & Greet](#) event in honor of National Police Week. Please join the members of the WSPD on Friday, May 13, from 4 – 6:30 pm in front of the Tower Green.

French Market Resumes:

- The French Market resumed on May 8. Be sure to stop by Hillgrove Avenue next to the Tower Green, each Sunday from May until October, between 9 am - 1 pm. Memorial Day Parade and Observance:

- VFW Post 10778 is pleased to announce the return of the annual Memorial Day Parade on [Monday, May 30](#). The parade starts at 10 am at Hillgrove and Hampton and ends at the Tower Green where a brief ceremony honoring members of the military will take place. The parade includes various community and sporting groups, marching bands, and members of the military.

Annual Household Clean-Up Day is Saturday, June 18:

- Each year the Village hosts [Household Clean-Up Day](#), when residents can dispose of household items including clothing, draperies, books, furniture, scrap metal, and appliances (household garbage, electronics, landscape waste, liquids, tires, batteries, medical waste, and construction and demolition debris are not eligible). Items for disposal must be on the curb by 7 am on the morning of collection day. More information is on the [website](#).

Wolf Road Rehabilitation:

- Cook County is rehabilitating Wolf Road this spring and summer, between Plainfield Road and 31st Street. This project includes curb and gutter repairs, asphalt pavement milling and resurfacing, concrete pavement patching, concrete pavement surface improvements, and new pavement markings.
